What is Acteur Communau'Terre?

The Acteur Communau'TERRE program, undertaken in partnership with the Friedrich Naumann Foundation, started in March 2016 for a period of six years, help to implement the proposals from the study "How to reinvent the rural land system in Côte d'Ivoire?" performed in 2014 and 2015 with the support of its partner the ATLAS Economic Research Foundation. This program was carried out in 7 pilot villages. It aims to clarify land rights in order to improve land governance in villages. It has two main components::

1 –A Community land register

The project team is helping the villagers to realize community land registers themselves in order to clarify the primary and secondary rights of customary rights holders and farmers. It is concretely a village map made from local traditional knowledge of the land boundaries.

2 – The training of Village Committees for Rural Land Management (CVGFR) in action

In order to improve local governance, a part of the program aims to improve the abilities of the CGVFR, which is a key structure within the village related to the administration.

Firstly, it is a question of creating them where they are not yet, or to review their composition if they are not working well. Then help them organize themselves through internal rules. Finally, train them to:

- Use the GPS independently;
- Manage and update the community land register;
- Archive data:
- Promote clear contractualization which gives rural land contracts high credibility.

Financial autonomy; contracts model; archiving management, etc.


Sustainable solutions are built with the players themselves.

Acteur Communau'Terre in a few figures



- 34 152 hectares delimited and mapped
- 83% of the villagers think that conflicts will be wiped out.
- 99% now feel safer
- 89% are more interested in investing in their land.
- 90 % of the villagers are convinced that there will be no more inheritance problems within the families.
- 89% of people are very proud to have successfully clarified all the land rights in their village.

Workshop on women's access to land

Workshop on rural land and human rights Training and awareness on the Voluntary Guidelines



In partnership with the German Institute for Human Rights, the National Commission for Human Rights in Côte d'Ivoire, the FAO and the Friedrich Naumann Foundation, Civil Society acting in the context of rural land and rights of human beings has been trained and made aware of voluntary guidelines as an interesting tool that can help to settle the land issue while respecting human rights.

Workshop on contractualisation of rural lands Contracts as tools for social cohesion and integration



In the chain of thematic workshops on rural land, a session was devoted to the contractualization. Indeed, contracts represent the whole unit of land security. The workshop allowed to analyze the subject mainly in terms of law.

Haut-parleur is a multidisciplinary training in public speaking geared towards a group of 25 young Ivorians to invite them to express their ideas, assert their values and develop self-confidence.

Young people from all walks of life:

- To break down social determinisms;
- break with the logic of inwardlooking attitudes and release the talents of a stigmatized youth;
- promote the employability of participants and offer to Ivorian companies a pool of young people with new profiles to consolidate the internal and external communication of their Organizations







Field visit with the administration and donors

A delegation from the Rural Land Agency (AFOR), the World Bank and the French Development Agency, visited the village of Barata in Sinfra to see the impact of Acteur Communau'Terre program.

The experience of Acteur Communau'Terre has allowed to feed several stages of the AFOR's operating manual, which include: the creation of a village land register; the creation of new job in the villages (surveyors using GPS in autonomy and archivists) and the stage of social dialogue around a brief map of the village to proceed to unravelling of land rights in the village.





Promotion of usage contracts for planters

The conference of Berlin was an opportunity for Gisèle Dutheuil, the Chief Executive of AIA, to promote contractualization for cocoa planters. Indeed, while we focus on land titles, usage contracts are neglected in the overall reflection on land security.

A written contract secures the planter who is more willing to invest in capital and efforts in this environment of land security. The planter clearly knows his place in the village and his rights are recognized by all. It is the base of social cohesion.

Economic freedom forum in Cote d'Ivoire

The economic freedom forum is carried out in Cote d'Ivoire in partnership with the ATLAS Network foundation, the Friedrich Naumann foundation and the Fraser Institute around a hundred targeted participants..

This forum has helped to analyze the economic freedom index in Cote d'Ivoire in order to identify the weaknesses and the real challenges to be met to improve the business environment. The goal is to get out of the myth of the economic freedom dangers that is disseminated. Economic freedom is often used as the scapegoat to hide the failure of governments. Based this, the right solutions are rejected.

Malgré de nombreux efforts réalisés par le Côte d'Ivoire au cours des dernière années, entre autres la création du Tribunal de commerce, la Cour d'appel de commerce, la facilitation de la création d'entreprises, la création de l'Agence Foncière Rural (AFOR), le soutien à la mise en œuvre de la Zone de Libre-Echange Continentale Africaine (ZLECAf), la Côte d'Ivoire figure toujours au 132 rang sur 162 économies évaluées. L'un des piliers de ce faible classement est la corruption. Le pays est encore classé au 103e rane de l'indice de perception de la corruption de Transparency International (sur 180 pays). Alors que la corruption est un véritable cancer pour la société. l'impact de la liberté économique sur la réduction de ce fléau est

Le manque de liberté économique est la matière première de la corruption. Si vous êtes économiquement libre et si vous avez la capacité de faire vos propres choix économiques : si personne n'entrave vos activités : si vos formalités administratives sont simples (pour ouvrir une entreprise, obtenir une décision de justice équitable, trouver un bon emploi sans devoir verser de pot-de-vin, etc); alors, vous serez faiblement soumis aux exigences de « donner des enveloppes » pour débloquer un dossier, obtenir un simple papier. La corruption sera ainsi drastiquement réduite.

L'ingérence persistante du gouvernement dans l'économie alimente également la corruption. Les acteurs économiques sont soumis à des paiements multiples et informels soit pour obtenir les faveurs du gouvernement, soit pour en éviter des pénalités. Les marché sont protégés pour des amis du pouvoir. On parle alors de capitalisme de copinage. Si le gouvernement libère l'économie et se met à l'écart, il n'y aura ni faveurs à acheter, ni de pots-de-vin à payer pour éviter d'éventuelles sanctions et la corruption en sera réduite d'autant.



Research study on the contractualization of customary lands not yet certified.

This study was carried out as part of the development of the activities of ALERTE-Foncier, which receives financial support from the European Union and the CCFD-terre Solidaire through a project led by the CCFD-Terre Solidaire, INADES- Formation and Audace Institut Afrique (AIA). In this project entitled "Alerte-Foncier Platform: For inclusive and sustainable governance of rural land in Côte d'Ivoire" FED / 2018/159508/4, AIA carried out this study on customary rights. This broad subject is approached here in the context of official contractualization on land for which customary rights have not yet been formalized.

The study has helped to answer clearly that it is legal to carry out usage contracts on land not yet registered by the government.

Actions in the context of Alerte Foncier

Rural land conflict observation unit - Alerte Foncier



His Majesty Désiré AMON TANOE, Chairman of CNRCT

Creation of a unit to observe rural land conflicts through 139 focal points of the National Chamber of Kings and Traditional Chiefs (CNRCT) through the 31 regions and 108 departments of the country

This national network with the chiefdom enables to provide contextualized and updated information linked to rural land conflicts to better understand the problems with the opinion of traditional chiefs who are the actors closest to the populations.

This partnership shows the CNRCT's interest in social cohesion in the country.
